	<p>Symptomatic persons with:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Fever or chills, Cough, Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, Fatigue, Muscle or body aches, Headache, New loss of taste or smell, Sore throat, Congestion or runny nose, and Nausea or Vomiting. <p>Symptomatic persons who are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Hospitalized • Healthcare workers and other first responders • Employees and residents in group living settings, and • Over 65 years old or with <u>underlying health conditions</u> that place them at higher risk of serious complications <p>Asymptomatic persons:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • If they are part of a public health investigation • If they live or work in high risk settings, such as skilled nursing facilities or homeless shelters • If they are a close contact of someone with a confirmed positive diagnosis of COVID-19, or • If they are an essential worker. <p>Prioritization of routine testing among other asymptomatic people is not recommended at this time. People over the age of 65 or with underlying conditions do not necessarily need to be</p>

tested unless they have symptoms, have had an exposure or have been told by public health to be tested. Please check with your healthcare provider about your specific situation and let their medical advice guide you.

- As of November 18, 2020, Access Services has completed 287,735 deliveries of meals, grocery boxes, and paper goods to people with disabilities and seniors across all projects to date.

- Total distributed to date at 54 events is 3,007 tons of food which is the equivalent 5 million meals provided to 90,087 households. We have now surpassed 6 million pounds of food distributed.
- #LetsFeedLACounty has secured 400 20-pound boxes of groceries from the LA Regional Food Bank for weekly delivery through the end of December to clients of the DHS Housing for Health program.
- Great Plates Program has been extended until 12/08/2020 and has a current service population: 8,027 seniors. (12% increase over past 30 days) Total meals served through this program since 5/12/2020: 2,290,686
