TESTING

No Appointment Needed

Free COVID-19 testing is available to all LA County residents at drive-up and walk-up testing sites. Appointments are currently not needed, and you are able to register on-site at LA County testing sites. Testing highly recommended for:

• **People who have symptoms**: If you have symptoms of COVID-19, talk to a healthcare provider and get tested.

- People who have been a close contact to someone with confirmed or suspected COVID-19 (a case) within the last 14 days. Even if your test is negative, you will still need to complete your quarantine.
- People with or without symptoms who are part of an outbreak response or contact investigation in high-risk settings, such as nursing homes, congregate living facilities, correctional facilities, or persons experiencing homelessness.

PUBLIC HEALTH COVID-19 CASE COUNTS

The Los Angeles County Department of Public Health is actively monitoring the number of COVID-19 cases reported throughout the County. As of 6/16/2021, 6,917,224 people in LA County have been tested for COVID-19 with 17% testing positive.
