Campground, RV Parks and Cabin Rental Units FAQs

Can I go camping?

Yes, campgrounds, campsites and RV parks are reopening. Each site should be occupied by members of the same household.

Can I go camping with my friends?

Members of the same household should camp together. People who are not from the same household must maintain physical distance of at least six feet and everyone should wear face coverings.

What kind of activities are allowed?

Outdoor recreation is allowed, but close-contact activities are limited to members of the same household. Examples of these activities include boating, volleyball games and rope courses.

Can I rent equipment for activities?

Rentals are allowed, but facilities may limit their rental program. It is recommended that you come prepared with everything you may need, including sporting equipment, when possible. If rentals are available, they must be cleaned and disinfected between each person's use.

Are playgrounds, conference spaces, or meeting rooms at campgrounds open? No, these facilities are closed, at this time.

Are group activities on campgrounds allowed?

No, public events or concentrated gatherings at campgrounds or RV parks, including group bonfires, group campsites, presentations at outdoor amphitheaters, musical or other performances, or other events must be cancelled or postponed. Most organized activities and sports such as basketball, baseball, soccer, and football that are held on park fields, open areas, and courts are not permitted, because they require coaches and athletes who are not from the same household or living unit to be in close proximity. Members of the same household may engage in such activities and sports together.

Will I be able to picnic while visiting campgrounds?

Picnicking at smaller picnic shelters, such as those that typically accommodate only household groups, will be open and available to the public. Use should be limited to one household at a time.

Are communal shower facilities open?

Yes, but if you have a vehicle with toilets or showers/bathing equipment, you are encouraged to use your own rather than shared facilities. Shower rooms may only be

used if partitions are in place or signs have been posted to specify physical distancing requirements.

Will public restrooms located in campgrounds be cleaned regularly?

Public restrooms should be cleaned and disinfected regularly using EPA registered disinfectants throughout the day. High-touch surfaces such as faucets, toilets, doorknobs and light switches must be frequently cleaned and disinfected. Campers should keep in mind that sinks could be an infection source and should avoid placing toothbrushes and other items directly on counter surfaces.
